

**Minutes of Cameron Community Council Meeting held in Cameron Hall on
16th January at 6:30pm**

Welcome: The chairman welcomed Cllr Donald MacGregor and PC Alan Laws to the meeting.

Minutes: Acceptance of minutes 21st November proposed by Dick Bond and seconded by John Wils.

Update from PC Alan Laws: The Scottish Police Force's new set up will commence on 1 April 2013, he doesn't envision many changes with regards to Community Policing.

Speeding through Cameron: it is not safe to do a speed check in Cameron due to 60mph limit and no safe place to pull drivers over. He agreed to speak to Road Policing to see if they could carry out any checks on drivers exceeding the speed limit, through Cameron generally and at the Kirk Road end junction with A915.

Speeding through Peat Inn: Speed checks were carried out, and no one was caught exceeding the limit. Cllr MacGregor advised that FC Transportation would be creating a road calming method, probably chicanes, in the next Financial Year commencing April 2013.

Matters Arising:

Cycle stand at Higham Toll. JT provided examples of different styles of stands and rough purchase estimates. Decision was that the simplest 'Frankton Cycle Stand' would be appropriate. **Action JT** to provide pricing to Fiona Mitchell of Fife Council.

Mirror at Kirk Road end? Re David Smeaton GB has spoken to Fife Council Transportation regarding the mirror, David Smeaton of Transportation advised that this would not be permitted on an A road due to possibility of headlights reflecting on mirror and causing a problem to drivers. Transportation will be looking at the road and making an assessment on what would be feasible to warn drivers on A915 of the joining road. JW re-raised the issue regarding visibility from Grange Road to road at Kinaldy Cross Roads

Correspondence:

GB had received a cautionary email regarding a current phone scam where someone purporting to be from BT advises that there is a balance due on the phone bill and if not paid immediately the telephone would be cut off. The person then, to prove they are from BT, asks you to put the phone down try phoning someone else – it appears that your phone is dead. 'They' then phone you back and ask for your credit /debit card.

The cutting off of the line is very simple, they stay on the line with the mute button on and you can't dial out - but can hear you trying. (This is because the person who initiates a call is the one to terminate it). When you stop trying he cuts off and immediately calls back.

CATS (Communities Against Turbines), has been wound up, a new organization is being formed SAS (Scotland Against Spin).

Planning Matters:

Lingo going to committee in February please try to attend the Planning Meeting at Cupar Planning Office, this is expected to be on 25th February.

Crematorium DB raised that he had been approached by several locals concerned about the crematorium. It was agreed that it would now be appropriate to request Montgomery Forgan to attend the next CCC meeting to present the plans to the community. There was a general discussion around the possibility of asking the developer to contribute toward the bike stand at Higham Toll as a good will gesture to the community. **Action JT** to contact Montgomery Forgan re presentation.

Kenly Appeal FC panning has advised that the University of St Andrews has lodged an appeal against the decision against them on the Kenly Wind Farm. Cllr Docherty suggested that we write to Lord Campbell asking if he can support the community in this appeal. Appeal reference PPA-250-2153.

Feddinch Golf Course:

JW advised that he has spoken to the developer and the plans are moving forward slowly, they are currently waiting on the Clubhouse planning consent. Section 75 relating to the course and clubhouse construction are still being worked, as soon as this is concluded the developer will start work, which they hope to be mid February.

Recruitment of members for Cameron CC:

Due to the recent resignation of 2 of the CCC members it would be beneficial to have some new members; GB suggested looking for members from Priormuir, Denhead, Peat Inn, Mount Melville and Ballone, with view to having members across the CCC area.

AOCB:

Development Trusts DB reminded us that in setting up a Trust the project should come first, suggesting that Craigton Park would be a worthwhile candidate. He asked that we put Development Trust on agenda for the February meeting and we think of ideas for suitable projects.

Expenses DB requested that any expenses are submitted at the next meeting.

Councillor Report: Cllr John Docherty advised that

- the speed limit is now restricted at Boarhills and Kingsbarns
- FC chose option 3 of the All Fife Planning Committee options. This would have no impact on East Fife.
- FC budget will be announced next month
