

**Minutes of Cameron Community Council Meeting held in Cameron Hall on 15<sup>th</sup>  
February 2012 at 6:30pm**

- Minutes:** Acceptance of the minutes of the 18<sup>th</sup> January 2012 meeting was proposed by Jennifer Wylie, seconded by Linda Cameron, approved and signed by the Treasurer.
- Matters Arising:** There were no matters arising.
- Correspondence:** We were contacted by our new Community Police Officer Susan Martin with a view to her meeting us so we invited her to come to our meeting to introduce her to the members. Having introduced herself she then took note of complaints about continued speeding through Peat Inn. Susan agreed to contact Transportation to establish when the traffic calming measures are to be put into place.
- Planning Matters:** CCC received notification that the Lingo Wind Farm Application had been submitted and that we should submit our comments within 28 days. We replied asking for a guide as to the best way of getting a response from the Community and relaying the response to Fife Council. To date there has not been a reply. It was decided to ask The Royal Mail if we could have questionnaires delivered to the Cameron Community Area as and when we need to, this also included the leaflet advertising 'Is Wind The Answer' for the 1<sup>st</sup> March.
- CCC had asked Fife Council Planning Department to be regarded as Consultees for the Lingo Wind Farm Application. They replied saying that only Arncroach and Carnbee CC would be eligible as Lingo Farm was in their area. They then corrected this statement and agreed for Cameron CC to be included as Consultees when I explained that the Lingo Wind Farm was across two CC areas Boarhills and Dunino CC and Arncroach and Carnbee CC but was in closest proximity to settlements in Cameron.

**Developments:**

Mr. John Wils contacted all the Feddinch residents and obtained a unanimous support for the Golf Course proposal. In response from the Developers they agreed to the following; No Floodlights, To avoid using the Lumbo Road for heavy vehicles, to repair the culvert at Rainbow Cottage at the developers expense. The proposed extension of the existing road leading to the Feddinch residents homes to be built and maintained by the Developer. John agreed to draft a letter for the CC to send to Fife Planning Department in support of the Development.

Our members were asked if they had any concerns or suggestions to make about the presentation planned at St Andrews Town Hall 'Is Wind The Answer' on the 1<sup>st</sup> March. No concerns were expressed and all were in favour of giving the local population the chance to learn more about the pros and cons of wind farms.

Gordon gave a brief report on the Reporters visit to Kinaldy Meadows following an appeal by Blazon Investments to build 5 houses on the site of the equestrian centre. The outcome will be made public in due course.

**A.O.C.B.**

Martin reported that one of the mileage stones that have recently been pained is in the wrong place. He offered to contact Fife Council and report several signs in the district were blown down in the recent storms and high winds.

It was mentioned that some members of Carnbee and Arncroach CC seem to be in support of the Lingo Wind Farm Proposal which is disturbing given that they are much further away from them than many houses in Cameron are.

There being no further competent business, the meeting closed at 8.15pm
